SUBJECT: Declaration of a Public Health Emergency for Peterson-Schriever Garrison, Colorado

1. On 23 March 2020, a public health emergency was declared by the 21 SW/CC, on Peterson Air Force Base (PAFB), as well as all subordinate commands and tenant units located at or near Colorado Springs, Colorado, to include Cheyenne Mountain Air Force Station (CMAFS), in accordance with DoD Instruction (DoDI) 6200.03, "Public Health Emergency Measures (PHEM) Within the DoD," and Air Force Instruction (AFI) 10-2519, "Public Health Emergencies and Incidents of Public Health Concern" (Attachment 1). On 23 March 2020, a public health emergency was declared by myself (as the 50 SW/CC), on Schriever Air Force Base (SAFB), as well as all subordinate commands and tenant units located at or near Colorado Springs, Colorado, also in accordance with the aforementioned authorities (Attachment 2). Those declarations have been continuously renewed since their original execution.

2. On 24 July 2020, at the direction of the Secretary of the Air Force, the 21 SW and 50 SW were inactivated, and the Peterson-Schriever Garrison (P-S GAR) was established. Pursuant to my authority as Commander, P-S GAR, and due to the same circumstances underlying the aforementioned public health emergency declarations (and subsequent renewals), I am declaring a public health emergency for PAFB, SAFB, CMAFS, and all P-S GAR subordinate commands and tenant units located at or near Colorado Springs, Colorado, for a period of 90 days from the date of execution of this memorandum

3. The installation Public Health Emergency Officer (PHEO), and all public health personnel, are hereby directed to continue to identify, confirm, and control this public health emergency utilizing all the necessary means outlined in DoDI 6200.03 and AFI 10-2519. To implement my direction, the PHEO may request to issue mandatory vaccinations, close base facilities, restrict movement, or implement quarantine for at risk individuals. Implementation of specific actions will be approved by me or my designee. The Health Protection Condition (HPCON) level framework will provide actions specific to this emergency, that each person should take to protect his or her health.

4. At my direction, the PHEO will coordinate activities and share information with public health authorities at the state, local, tribal and territorial levels responsible for public health and public safety. Shared information may include personally identifiable health information only to the extent necessary to protect public health and safety.

5. Any person who refuses to obey or otherwise violates an order during this declared public health emergency may be detained. Those not subject to military law may be detained until civil

authorities can respond. Violators of procedures, protocols, provisions, or orders issued in conjunction with this public health emergency may be charged with a crime under the Uniform Code of Military Justice and under Section 271 of Title 42, United States Code (U.S.C.). Violators are subject to a fine up to \$1,000 or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both.

SUBJECT: Declaration of a Public Health Emergency on Peterson Air Force Base, Colorado

1. In order to facilitate coordination with El Paso County in support of their proclamation of a local emergency, as well as civilian authorities, I am declaring a public health emergency in accordance with DoD Instruction (DoDI) 6200.03, "Public Health Emergency Management (PHEM) Within the DoD," and Air Force Instruction (AFI) 10-2519, "Public Health Emergencies and Incidents of Public Health Concern." This declaration will terminate automatically 30 days from the date of this memorandum unless it is renewed and re-reported or terminated sooner by me or a senior commander in the chain of command.
2. The installation Public Health Emergency Officer (PHEO) and public health personnel are hereby directed to identify, confirm, and control this public health emergency utilizing all the necessary means outlined in DoDI 6200.03 and AFI 10-2519. To implement my direction, the PHEO may issue guidance that affects installation personnel and property, and other individuals working, residing, or visiting this installation (e.g., closing base facilities, restricting movement, or implementing quarantine or isolation for select individuals).
3. At my direction, the PHEO will coordinate activities and share information with El Paso County Health Department and other Colorado Health Departments. Shared information may include personally identifiable health information only to the extent necessary to protect the public health and safety.
4. Any person who refuses to obey or otherwise violates an order during this declared public health emergency may be detained. Those not subject to military law may be detained until civil authorities can respond. Violators of procedures, protocols, provisions, or orders issued in conjunction with this public health emergency may be charged with a crime under the Uniform Code of Military Justice and under Section 271 of Title 42, United States Code (U.S.C.). Pursuant to Section 271 of Title 42, U.S.C., violators are subject to a fine up to \$1,000 or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both. This delegation of authority is effective immediately and supersedes any previous delegations.
